

Victoria Children's Choir Return to Singing Covid-19 Safety Plan for Members



Overview & Purpose

Victoria Children's Choir (VCC) has updated this Return to Singing plan for 2021-22 operations to inform all participants, staff, parents/guardians, venues and volunteers about the policies and procedures in place to prevent the transmission of COVID-19 and maintain a safe and healthy environment for all during the COVID-19 pandemic. This plan is approved by our Board of Directors and each facility that we partner with in the community.

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Phase 3 Measures

Arrival	During Rehearsal	Departure
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arrive no earlier than 10 minutes prior to rehearsal • Water bottle must be pre-filled • Meet your Manager at the designated entrance door prior to entry and confirm attendance. • Families are responsible for pre-screening. Do not attend rehearsal if you are feeling unwell, have been in close contact with someone with Covid-19 or have travelled out of the county within the past 2 weeks. • Sanitize your hands prior to entering the building. • Parents will not be permitted inside the rehearsal venues at this time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Masks must be worn at all times indoors • Physical distancing must be observed as required • Only one person may use a washroom at a time. Staff must clean washrooms after each use. • No sharing of music, water bottles, snacks etc. • No kitchen facilities or water fountains will be used at any time 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Depart the building as soon as rehearsal is completed. • Follow one way markings/arrows • Sign-out with your Manager at the designated exit • Parents must make visual contact with our choir manager before we will release each child (Prelude and Recital choirs only)

Proof of Vaccination

- Choristers participating in organized youth recreational activities with less than 50 participants are exempt from presenting proof of vaccination
- Staff participating in organized youth recreational activities with less than 50 participants are exempt from presenting proof of vaccination.
- Spectators who attend events (ie. Concerts) with more than 50 attendees will require proof of vaccination at this time.

Stay Away When Sick

No chorister, staff, or volunteer should attend a VCC rehearsal, event or facility if they are unwell. The symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to other respiratory illnesses including the flu and common cold. All members are advised to stay at home if they are feeling unwell.

If they start experiencing symptoms while at an event, they must:

- isolate themselves from others immediately
- notify their manager
- excuse themselves from the event as soon as possible

Members who start displaying respiratory symptoms should use the BC COVID 19 self- assessment tool and follow all instructions provided.

Return to Singing after Illness

Members can return to in-person rehearsals 10 days after all symptoms have resolved. If a member tests positive for COVID-19, they can return to in-person rehearsals only after clearance from a physician. On-line rehearsals will be available for all choirs.
